***Katrina and Her Psychiatric Aftermath: a
View from the Front Lines***
(Morning presentation)

Program Purpose

Mental health and other social service settings today recognize that a past history of exposure to recurrent trauma, abuse, and neglect has played a significant role in the development of maladaptive social behavior. The Sanctuary Model[®] represents a trauma-informed method for creating or changing an organizational culture to more effectively provide a cohesive context within which healing from psychological and social traumatic experience can be addressed. This seminar will focus on what it means to "create Sanctuary" for traumatized children and adults and the ways in which organizational stress can interfere with our best intentions to help traumatized clients to heal.

Learning Objectives

Upon completion of the program, the participant shall be able to:

- 1) Describe the psychiatric ramifications of a large-scale disaster, both in the immediate aftermath and the recovery.
- 2) Identify the effect of the post-Katrina mental health crisis in New Orleans on law enforcement and criminal justice agencies.
- 3) Recognize the effect of the post-Katrina mental health crisis in New Orleans on the public and private healthcare system
- 4) Restate lessons learned from the post-Katrina mental health crisis in New Orleans.

Faculty:

Jeffrey Rouse, MD is a Clinical Instructor and Fellow in Forensic Neuropsychiatry in the Tulane University Department of Psychiatry and Neurology and Chief Deputy Coroner of Orleans Parish. He graduated Phi Beta Kappa from Duke University, received his M.D. from Georgetown University, and completed training in adult psychiatry at Tulane University Department of Psychiatry and Neurology in 2005. For his efforts in establishing emergency medical and psychiatric services in the immediate aftermath of Hurricane Katrina and for his assistance to the New Orleans Police Department, he was awarded the 2007 Bruno Lima Award for Excellence in Disaster Psychiatry by the American Psychiatric Association. Dr. Rouse, as an advocate for reinstatement of mental health infrastructure after Hurricane Katrina, is currently a board member of Metropolitan Human Services District and serves on the Treatment Expansion Committee of the Criminal Justice Leadership Alliance. He is an on-scene consultant to the Crisis Negotiation Team of the Special Operations Division of the New Orleans Police Department, a psychiatrist with Jefferson Parish Mobile Crisis Unit, and a consultant to the Mental Health Court of the Orleans Parish Criminal District Court. Clinically, he specializes in crisis intervention, forensic psychiatry, and treatment of severe mental illness. He lives in New Orleans with his wife and three small children.

***DISASTER PLANNING—COUNSELING
NEEDED***

(Afternoon presentation)

Program Purpose

The purpose of this session is to provide the knowledge, principles, and tools to develop an "all hazards" emergency operations plan.

On conclusion of this session, attendees should be able to achieve the following goals:

1. Identify the clinician's role in adapting standards of care under extreme conditions.
2. Describe how National Incident Management System (NIMS) and Hospital Incident Command System (HICS) protocols allow for a fluid management of any disaster event affecting operations.
3. Incorporate the four phases and six critical elements of emergency management into an emergency operations plan applicable to the current work environment.
4. Describe "all hazards" approach to emergency management planning and response.

Faculty:

Gail Maxwell, RN, MS, FACHE joined the senior management team at Baylor University Medical Center in July, 2002 as the Vice President, Administration. Her areas of responsibilities include Radiology and Respiratory Care Services, Neuroscience Center, Trauma Program, Construction, Engineering, and Facility Management. June 2006, Ms. Maxwell also was named Baylor Health Care System Vice President responsible for system wide Environmental Safety and Emergency Management.

Gail received her Bachelor of Nursing Degree from Central State University and her Masters of Science Degree from the University of Oklahoma. Ms. Maxwell has a strong academic background as well as years of management experience. She was assistant clinical professor at the University of Oklahoma for 8 years. Her strong operational background includes strategic planning and implementing change with positive outcomes.

Ms. Maxwell has spoken both throughout the United States and internationally related to the use of technology to change patient flow through the continuum of care. Lecture tours include England, Germany, Belgium, New Zealand, and Australia.

Walter Cassity, HEM is the Corporate Director for the Department of Environmental Safety and Emergency Management for Baylor Health Care System based in Dallas, TX. He accepted this role in June 2006 after serving as a Corporate Safety Manager for Baylor Health Care System and Safety Officer for Baylor University Medical Center since 1997. Cassity's primary role is system oversight of the Environment of Care including the seven management functions: Emergency Management, Safety, Security, Hazardous Materials, Medical Equipment and Utilities Management. Responsibilities in emergency management include oversight of regional facility directors and disaster

coordinator that manage the emergency operations plans for 13 hospitals in the Dallas/Ft.Worth Metroplex. Much of his time is spent coordinating these hospitals emergency operations plans with local, regional, and state planning efforts.
