Southbound and Northbound on I-35:

This course prepares therapists, chaplains, nurses, social workers, school counselors, teachers, ministers, first responders, EAP staff, administrators and other professionals to understand and respond effectively to persons dealing with critical incidents, disasters and other traumatic events. Along with three free online FEMA courses (IS-7, A Citizen's Guide to Disaster, IS-100, Introduction to Incident Command, and IS-700, National Incident Management System), the course also fulfills requirements for certification as *Field Traumatologist* with the Green Cross Academy of Traumatology.

Multi-media presentations, small and large group activities, individual exercises, lecture, dialogue and evaluations will be utilized. A personalized certificate and CEUs will be presented to each participant completing the course. Fifteen hours of CEUs have been approved for LPCs, LMFTs, LBPs and LCSWs (CEP #20080095) in Oklahoma.

The schedule is 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. both days with registration and coffee at 7:45 a.m. on Thursday. It includes a fifteen-minute break morning and afternoon, plus an hour break for lunch (*on your own*).

Course Goals

- Prepare participants to lessen the impact of a disaster or critical incident on individuals, families, groups and communities
- Affirm and expand professional competencies in the provision of crisis intervention services
- Facilitate health and well-being of professional caregivers through education, networking, support and self-care measures
- Prepare participants for future deployment opportunities in post-disaster locations, both near and far.
- Fulfill partial criteria for certification as Field Traumatologist with the Green Cross Academy of Traumatology

OVERVIEW

At the end of the course, participants will be able to:

THURSDAY, MAY 15

- Give a brief history of traumatology
- Identify the phases of a disaster and phases of emergency management
- Understand the continuum of stress responses and the causes of trauma
- Identify the risk factors for PTSD
- Recognize symptoms of simple and complex PTSD
- Identify the phases of recovery from trauma
- Understand the role of spirituality in trauma response and recovery

FRIDAY, MAY 16

- Specify factors involved in preparation for post-disaster deployment
- Identify key concepts of field traumatology and four waves of disaster intervention
- Understand wave-appropriate interventions and principles of emergency mental health
- Understand psychological first aid, including defusing and debriefing protocols (limitations, risks and guidelines for use with individuals and groups)
- Function within the post-disaster incident command system
- Assess the impact of trauma work on the caregiver and identify symptoms of burnout and compassion fatigue
- Apply prevention and self-care strategies to facilitate professional effectiveness

About the Instructor

Jay Martin, D. Min., L.M.F.T., is co-director of the Oklahoma Traumatology Institute and Director of the Center for Families in Transition in Oklahoma City where he has maintained a private practice since 1992. Dr. Martin is a Certified Traumatologist and Compassion Fatigue Specialist and Educator with the Green Cross Academy of Traumatology, Clinical Fellow with the American Association of Pastoral Counselors, and Clinical Member of the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy. He has provided training for staff working with victims of the American Embassy bombing in Kenya in 1998, and provided training in Manhattan as a volunteer with the Green Cross Project in September of 2001. In addition to working with numerous individuals following the Oklahoma City bombing, Dr. Martin has led traumatology, compassion fatigue, and crisis intervention workshops in Oklahoma, New York, New Jersey, Washington D.C., North Carolina, Texas, Utah, Nevada, Kansas, Michigan, Arizona, Tennessee, Florida, South Carolina, Missouri, Canada and Kenya.

Oklahoma Traumatology Institute

The Oklahoma Traumatology Institute was established in 1999 and is a licensed site of the Green Cross Academy of Traumatology based in Tallahassee, Florida. The Institute's purpose is to provide education, training, consultation, and crisis intervention services for those impacted by a disaster, either natural or human-caused. The directors of the Institute were intricately involved in the provision of services following the Oklahoma City bombing and the World Trade Center attack. They are certified by the Green Cross Academy of Traumatology in Field Traumatology, Clinical Traumatology and Compassion Fatigue and hold professional memberships in other trauma-related professional organizations.
