

Statewide Education Series: Oklahoma Institute for Mental Health and Substance Abuse Education and Training

Section A:** Ethical Dilemmas While Meeting Mental Health Care Needs.

Section B: Dreams and Healing

Faculty

Rockey Robbins, PhD received his doctorate from the University of Oklahoma in 1998. He is a Fulbright scholar. He has worked in Indian education and Indian psychology for over twenty years. The past five years he has worked as a professor in Counseling Psychology, first at Oklahoma State and now at the University of Oklahoma. Previously he worked as a clinical psychologist at Behavioral Health at Creek Nation and councils groups with Indian Families since the late eighties. His research focus has been with assessment, therapeutic techniques, grand-parenting, and effects of boarding schools upon Indian people. He regularly presents workshops across the United States.

Program Purpose

This training will help participants gain insight into their own dreams, as well as, their clients and to help them bring resolution to conflicts by going through issues that emerge. Special attention will be given to those who work with drug and alcohol issues.

Section C: Title 43A and Law Enforcement - Understanding the Culture and the Training

Faculty

Lieutenant Mike Isaac, CLEET is a 23 year veteran of the Norman Police Department. He has served in the Paramedic, Criminal Investigations and Patrol Divisions. He is a certified trainer for the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation. He currently sits on the boards of the Thunderbird Clubhouse, The Oklahoma City Police Department advisory board for Cops Helping Alleviate Police Problems (C.H.A.P.P.S.), the Cleveland County PACT team, and the treatment team of the Cleveland County Anna McBride court. He is a graduate of the University of Oklahoma, (MPA) and Oklahoma City University (BS). He has authored or co authored several medical research papers and served in the USMCR.

Program Purpose

This workshop will educate the Law Enforcement and Mental Health communities, policy makers, consumers of services and family members in the legal and practical responsibilities of Law Enforcement in interacting with the mentally ill and building effective relationships with the various providers for effective referrals for mental Health services.

2. Review a 'model' policy for law enforcement interaction with the mentally ill;

- Demonstrate in a 'role play' scenarios common to law enforcement in dealing with the mentally ill and with service providers.

Faculty

- Demonstrate basic cultural competency skills that they can use to enhance the services they provide, and improve the interactions they have with co-workers, consumers, and the general public; and
- Develop a cultural competency plan for themselves and their respective programs.

through small and large group interactions to explore the levels of cultural awareness, sensitivity and competency. Participants will develop practical skills for themselves, and the programs for which they work.

Registration and Fees
